1	Scheme Action 1: Wrong way drivers was discussed. Scheme to review whether drivers could possibly travel the wrong way and consider any appropriate mitigations that the scheme can put in place.			
2	Scheme Action 2: The scheme proposal to provide lighting on the slip roads and not the main line was discussed and in particular whether this causes any confusion to drivers on the mainline. Scheme to ensure a lighting assessment is undertaken and confirm rationale for lighting.			
3	Scheme Action 3: It was queried what the timing was for securing designated funds to determine whether the pedestrian bridge for the bus stops is in scope. Scheme to confirm and take forward accordingly.			
4	Scheme Action 4: A possible safety issue regarding the likelihood of rear end shunts was noted where there is a short slip road with a turning right movement a Church Lane. Scheme to review this issue and establish whether the design meet DMRB requirements.			
5	Scheme Action 5: Scheme to review the cyclist movements through the scheme There is a need to understand what happens to the cyclists on Old Maidstone Road. Scheme also to review any signing requirements for pedestrians and cyclists.			
6	Scheme Action 6: It was queried whether there is a visibility issue at New Maidstone Link Road. Scheme to review accordingly.			

7	Scheme-Action-7: Scheme to consider whether there is an opportunity to remove the southern laybys and put them on the local road network.				
8	Scheme Action 8: The free flow lanes were discussed and whether it is clear to road users which lane they need to be in. Scheme to review the traffic model to confirm demand exists and also check that the design enables drivers to get into the right lane at the right time.				
9	Scheme Action 9: Scheme to review the VMS on the A249 south of the junction and consider whether it should be changed to an MS3.				
10	Scheme Action 10: Scheme to contact the Expressways team (Thomas Davies) and check whether the route is planned for an Expressway. This will enable consideration of future proofing.
