HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

THE HIGHWAYS ENGLAND (A249 TRUNK ROAD STOCKBURY ROUNDABOUT IMPROVEMENTS) (SIDE ROADS) ORDER 2019

Highways England Company Limited (“Highways England”), a strategic highways company, hereby give notice that it has made, and is about to submit to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation, an Order under Sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising Highways England to -

- (a) improve a highway (including raising, lowering or otherwise altering),
- (b) stop up a highway,
- (c) construct a new highway,
- (d) stop up private means of access to premises, and
- (e) provide new means of access to premises.

all on or in the vicinity of the A249 Trunk Road which Highways England are authorised by “The A249 Trunk Road (Stockbury Roundabout Improvements) Order 20..”; to provide.

- (5) Sittingbourne Library Central Avenue, Sittingbourne, Kent, ME10 4AH; and
- (6) Maidstone Library Kent History And Library Centre, James Whatman Way, Maidstone, Kent, ME14 1LQ.

Any person may not later than 25 July 2019, object to the confirmation of the Side Roads Order by notice to the Secretary of State for Transport, at the National Transport Casework Team, Tyneside House, Skinnerburn Road, Newcastle Business Park, Newcastle upon Tyne NE4 7AR, or by email to nationalcasework@df.gov.uk, stating the title of the Side Roads Order and the grounds of their objection. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

In submitting an objection or representation it should be noted that your personal data and correspondence will be passed to Highways England to enable your objection or representation

to be considered. If you do not wish your personal data to be forwarded, please state your reasons when submitting your objection or representation and the Secretary of State will copy your representations, with your name and address removed, to Highways England; if there is to be a Public Local Inquiry they will be seen in that form by the public and the Inspector, who may give them less weight as a result. Highways England may disclose your objections or representations, with your name and address removed, to other parties acting on its behalf.
